

## Transportation Plan heads to City Council for approval

The City's first-ever Multimodal Transportation Plan (MMTP) has been advancing since its launch in 2021. The project team will be presenting a draft of the Plan in a joint meeting with City Council and the Planning Commission on Sept. 5. From there, a Final Plan will be presented to City Council for a first reading approval on Oct. 17. ## MHHS Advisory Committee to make recommendations

In 2021, Lafayette voters supported a 0.1% sales and use tax increase to provide funding assistance to nonprofit



organizations that provide mental health and human services (MHHS) to Lafayette residents. In July, a seven-member MHHS Advisory Committee was appointed to review grant applications from area service providers and make funding recommendations to City Council.

Residents are invited to review the MHHS Advisory Committee's work and recommendations by attending an upcoming public meeting on Sept. 18, Oct. 9, or Oct. 19, or by submitting written comments.
